## Overview of Cleanup Program

The Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe (SRMT) is generously funding a cleanup for the community. This cleanup will allow residents to dispose of unwanted white goods, scrap metal and bulky items.

The Tribe's Solid Waste Management Program will be offering curbside collection of materials in different areas of the community from May 21-July 13, 2012. Please see back of this brochure to determine when collection will occur in your area.

## Questions

**Will Tribal staff go into my house or garage to collect the materials?**

**No.** You need to place your materials at the road in order for them to be picked up.



**How much will it cost?**

The service is free. The Tribe is paying for this special collection.

**Does this special collection include my regular household garbage?**

**No.** Only bulky items, white goods and scrap metal will be collected.

## White Goods & Scrap Metal Collection

**What are white goods?**

White goods are appliances found in houses. These include refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, stoves, ovens, toasters, microwaves, washers, dryers and hot water heaters.

**What is scrap metal?**

Scrap metal is material made of the following metals: steel, stainless steel, tin, iron, aluminum; copper, brass, magnesium and alloys.

**What materials will the Tribe collect?**

The Tribe will collect bed frames, bicycles, push or self-propelled lawn mowers<sup>1</sup> (no riding lawn mowers) pipes (no pieces longer than 4 feet) and other miscellaneous metal items.

**Will the Tribe collect automobile parts? No.**

**Will the Tribe collect tires? No.**

<sup>1</sup> **Lawnmower engines need to be free from oil and gas.**

## Bulky Items Collection



**What bulky items will the Tribe collect?**

The Tribe will collect the following bulk items:  
old furniture, mattresses,



non-metal appliances, televisions, electronic components, computers and computer monitors.

**What about materials I accumulated from renovating my house?**

The Tribe will collect these types of materials on a limited basis. We will collect siding, drywall, lumber (no pieces longer than 4 feet), carpets and insulation. No pallets or wastes generated from construction businesses will be collected.



**Can I include household hazardous wastes?**

**No.** Household hazardous wastes include: paints and paint cans, waste oil, anti-freeze, materials that contain asbestos, lead/acid batteries, paint thinner and cleaning products.

## Electronic Recycling

### Acceptable Materials:

- computers (desktops & laptops) & computer accessories (mice, keyboards, webcams, speakers, microphones, etc.)
- printers (ink or toner) & ink/toner cartridges
- computer monitors (CRT, LCD, LED)
- televisions (CRT, LCD, LED, Plasma, 3D)
- microwave ovens (non PCB)
- copiers/fax machines, scanners, typewriters
- telephones, cell phones & chargers
- GPS units, pagers, PDAs, tablets, answering machines
- MP3 players, radios/boom boxes, CD players, etc.
- storage devices (external hard drives, solid state drives, SD cards, memory cards, card readers, etc.)
- audio equipment speakers, microphones, DJ equipment, receivers, recording devices, headphones, etc.)
- video equipment (cameras, video cameras, webcams, recording devices, etc.)
- communications equipment
- medical testing & laboratory equipment
- cables, wires, power cords, power strips
- most home appliances (no refrigerators)
- rechargeable dry cell batteries (nickel cadmium-NiCad, nickel metal hydride – NiMH, lithium ion - li-ion)
- Anything with a circuit board

### Non-Acceptable Materials:

- freon containing devices/materials (refrigerators, air conditioners, de-humidifiers)
- household hazardous waste materials
- materials containing and/or leaking liquids
- yard equipment
- radioactive materials
- PCB containing materials
- large appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers)
- dry cell batteries (Absolyte, alkaline, mercury, zinc air with mercury, lithium primary, lithium thionyl chloride, button cells, lead acid gel)
- wet cell batteries (zinc air, zinc air with mercury, nickel iron, nickel cadmium)
